Knights in Action

What happened in August and September 2023? -

Football Ticket Raffle Sale – Once again this year, under the leadership of Brother Mike Crosthwait, we had an extraordinarily successful football raffle sale. The following is a summary of our football raffle sales. Council 6673 at Holy Trinity sold 1179 tickets raising \$24,200. Our share of the costs this year was \$5,600. Total Proceeds were \$18,600! From that number, we payout to our partners: Daughters of Isabella - \$690; St John 4th Degree - \$975; Duchesne 4th Degree - \$355. We donated \$10,000 to the Sister Servants of Mary in Kansas City, KS. That leaves \$6,580 for the Council's yearly giving. Those gifts are \$3,000 for the High School Scholarship, \$2,500 for the Refund Support Vocation Program (RSVP) supporting five seminarians; and \$500 for the HT School Library. That leaves \$580 for various other Council uses.

<u>August and September 2023 Food Drive Results</u> – Our monthly food drives were held before and after all the Masses on August 19th and 20th and September 16th and 17th. These drives resulted in the Knights collecting a combined total of **5,027 pounds** of food and **\$4,789 in cash donations** for Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas.

<u>Knights Help with Youth Rummage Sale</u> – Again this year, the Knights helped prepare for the rummage sale by laying carpet pads on the gym floor and setting tables. The Knights also helped with the cleanup after the event.

<u>Devine Wine Tasting Event</u> – On August 12, 2023, Holy Trinity hosted its annual Devine Wine Tasting event in the Quigley Center. Again, this year, several Knights participated in the event by serving hors d'oeuvres and wine to our guests.

Reception for Sr. Kenosis - On Saturday, August 19, 2023, Sr. Kenosis, a young lady from Holy Trinity Parish, took her final vows at a mass celebrated by Archbishop Naumann. At the request of the Servants of the Lord, our council provided a catered meal in Quigley for approximately one hundred guests immediately following the ceremony.

The Daughters of Isabella handled the setup of the ballroom, served the meal, and cleaned up after the event.

<u>Knights' Quarterly Mass</u> – Our Knights Quarterly Mass was held at 8:00 a.m., on Saturday, September 16, 2023. This Mass was immediately followed by a Rosary and a Knights Exemplification Ceremony during which six new members joined our council.

Refund Support Vocation Program – Through this program, our council provides funds to support seminarians in formation in their areas. For fraternal years 2023-2024, our council has voted to support the following seminarians with a donation of \$500 each:

Membership Drive Update – Our council's membership drive was held on August 19-20, 2023. Our membership quota for the year is 15 Since the start of this fraternal year, we have added nine new members, so we sit at 60% of the quota. We have another six who have signed up and are pending exemplifications (either online or in person). Another six are considering joining. We also added four fourth-degree transfers to our assembly. Thanks to everyone who helped in making this a successful event.

Coats for Kids – The Knights Supreme Council has agreed with the Kansas State Knights Council this year to match our Coats for Kids purchase one for one. In anticipation of this approval, our council placed an order for eight cases in early September at the District Meeting in Leawood. That is sixteen cases we will be able to distribute. Last year our council purchased and distributed 13 cases of children's coats to the Don Bosco/Literacy KC organization in Kansas City in support of their refugee program. Catholic Charities will manage this year's coat distribution and coats will be distributed the week before Thanksgiving at four locations in our area at the Family Support Centers in Overland Park, Olathe, Leavenworth, and Wyandotte County. Our Grand Knight is also working with

Catholic Charities and St. Vincent DePaul to ensure that we also provide coats to All Saints Parish and St. Mary's Parish in Kansas City, Kansas. We are also planning to provide coats to Don Bosco/Literacy KS this year. Adult coats collected during our annual coat drive this year will go to Operation Uplift.

<u>Blue Santa</u> – Blue Santa is a charitable initiative by the Lenexa Police Department intended to provide select underprivileged students from Lenexa schools with the financial means to purchase holiday gifts for their families. Lenexa school resource officers will work together with the nine Lenexa elementary schools to select students to participate. In total, nine students in either 5th or 6th grade will be selected.

The Grand Knight and our Community Director visited with the representatives of the Lenexa Police Department to start preparation for this year's Blue Santa event which will be held on December 7, 2023, in the Quigley Center. We will follow the same format that we used last year and will seek the help of the Daughters of Isabella, Trinity Threaders, and others to help with wrapping presents, food preparations, and games. More information on this event will be shared during upcoming council meetings.

Wreaths Across America – The National Wreaths Across America's mission is to Remember, Honor, and Teach. This mission is carried out by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at more than 4,000+ locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea, and abroad. Wreaths Across America believes the tradition represents a living memorial that honors veterans, active-duty military, and their families. Every year since 2008, Congress proclaims a Saturday in December as National Wreaths Across America Day. This year's Wreaths Across America Day will take place on December 16, 2023. On that day, more than two million Veterans' Wreaths will be placed at local, national, and military cemeteries as well as Veterans' Memorials and historic sites.

This year our Council and the St. John's Assembly have combined our efforts to participate in the National Wreaths Across America Day event on December 16, 2023, at Resurrection Catholic Cemetery in Lenexa.
